

The car that had everything

One of the cars the R.E. Olds Museum hopes to have on display when the museum formally opens within the next year is a 1937 Oldsmobile two-door touring sedan now housed in the division's Exhibit & Display department.

The vehicle was advertised as "The car that has everything." The riding qualities of the Oldsmobile Eight, with its knee-action wheels and dual ride stabilizers, were at that time the last word in comfort. The body had the new Unisteel Turret Top by Fisher. Some of the other accessories were bumpers, bumper guards, spare tire and tube, metal spring covers.

The interiors of the 1937
Oldsmobiles were roomy and
extremely attractive. A choice of
attractive tweed cloth or rich mohair
upholstery was optional on the Six,
while on the Eight you had the
selection of a boucle cloth in tan, grey
or a fine taupe mohair.

The instrument panel had an unique new lighting treatment. The hardware was artistic chromium with an attractive chevron design etching. The turnet top featured no-draft ventilation, solid steel welded construction, increased passenger room, double adjustable front seat, a spacious luggage compartment and safety glass throughout. The grilles for the Six and Eight were totally different in design so each car had its own distinctive and different appeal.

Oldsmobile ads termed the 1937 Olds "Beautiful, luxuriously comfortable, thoroughly dependable, economical and thrilling in performance." Hood lines, hood louvers, front and rear body contours, front and rear fenders, and wheels

were all redesigned to produce an exterior appearance that was new, distinctive and harmonized with the grille of each car.

The unisteel turret top body was just what its name implied - one structure of steel - top, bottom, sides - welded into a solid steel unit. Overhead was a one-piece steel turret top, arched and crowned for greater strength and braced with steel crossbows. Under foot was a seamless solid steel floor with grooved indentations, also for increased strength. In front, steel pillars were welded to the steel cowl and the seamless steel top. The center pillar was made of two steel sections welded together and in turn, welded to the steel under-body structure at the bottom and to the side roof rail at the

All body panels, stamped from tough drawn steel, were welded to steel floor, steel roof and steel cowl. The new doors were so rigidly constructed and so securely attached that each door would support the weight of a 250-pound man without any distortion whatsoever.

A novel front seat adjustment causing the rear of the front seat cushion to be raised and the seat back to be tipped forward in one movement was a new feature on the 1937 Olds. Another important comfort feature was unobstructed floors, front and rear, with maximum foot room. The parking brake lever was mounted under the dash on the left side readily accessible to the driver.

Fisher Body's ventilation system provided adequate ventilation without drafts and could be individually controlled by both front and rear passengers.

Wheelbase for the Six was 117"; on the Eight — 124". The Six was powered by a 95 h.p. engine while the Eight delivered 110 h.p. Price for the Six cylinder two-door touring sedan was \$765.00; with Eight cylinders, the car cost \$865.00.

Total 1937 Olds production was 79,830.
